### **NEW BUSINESS**

## 1. Pepsi Contract

Director McClure shared details of the new agreement with Pepsi to be the sole beverage provider of the Baldwin City Recreation Commission in a 3-year agreement.

## 2. Smoke on the Bricks

Director McClure shared with the Commission that there are currently 24 teams signed up for Smoke on the Bricks. McClure also shared sponsorship information as well as partners of the event including the Lumberyard Arts Center and the Baldwin Golf Association.

3. July 4<sup>th</sup> (6<sup>th</sup>)

Director McClure shared the status of the event. All bands are booked, the stage light and sound is confirmed and food and drink details are being ironed out. Title sponsor of the event in 2019 is Kansas State Bank.

## 4. Maple Leaf Gravel Grind

Director McClure shared with the Board that the Maple Leaf Gravel Grind is taking the place of the Cappuccino Ride that was held in May of 2018. The MLGG will take place on Saturday, October 12<sup>th</sup> and will include a 12-35-70-mile route. The Ottawa Bike Shop is providing goodie bags for the riders as well as a bike that will be raffled off. Proceeds of the race will go to Prairie Paws Animal Shelter in Ottawa, KS. In addition, the BCRC Cancer Challenge will also coincide with the bike race on the same weekend at the same time.
