1. Liability Insurance for BCRC

The current Liability Insurance for BCRC expires in May, the Board made a motion to approve Liability Insurance provider at an amount not to exceed \$15,000. Barth made a motion, Stultz made a 2^{nd} , motion passed 5-0.

2. Waiver of Fees for charity events

In an effort to recoup some costs associated with running events at the sports complex, the Board approved a fee of \$200 to be collected from groups that put on tournaments for charity. Outside organizations (non-charity groups) will continue to follow the field rental policies.

BCRC is now the operator of the Community Wellness Festival. The Board agrees this goes along with our mission. BCRC will not operate at a loss and will price vendors accordingly. No action taken.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

- Recreation Commission Summit Recap Board President Honomichl provided a recap of the Recreation Summit held in Hays, KS April 3-4. Honomichl shared that the Summit was worthwhile, the educational sessions were appropriate, and the networking opportunities were very important.
- BCRC Sponsorship Partners and Stats
 Director McClure shared with the Board that banner sales at the sports complex are up to \$7,775 so far this spring and baseball softball team sponsorships are sold out, raising \$3,100.
- Lotatorium Management
 Director McClure shared with the Board that the City approved the design of the
 Lotatorium on April 16th and now the project will go out to bid. He also shared that
 BCRC is still being considered for management responsibilities.
- Smoke on the Bricks

 Director McClure shared with the Board that current team numbers sit at 29 for the inaugural event.
- BCRC Strategic Master Plan

 Director McClure shared with the Board that he has reached out to two consultants on the development of a strategic master plan and is gathering cost estimates currently.
- July Budget Meeting Date
 Director McClure requested that the July Board Meeting be bumped to the 10th of July due to some availability issues. After discussion, the Board agreed to meet on Wednesday, July 10th as opposed to the 17th in 2019.

- Banner sales for the spring sit at \$7,775

Director Report-

- Tammy Michael took the Aquatic Facility Operator course through KRPA on March 20-21 and passed and has earned the AFO designation. As laid out in the BCRC policy manual, Tammy will receive \$250 from the commission for passing the class and earning the certification.
- Attended Recreation Commission Summit in Hays, KS April 3-4.
- Since January 1st, BCRC has approved \$1,867 in youth sports scholarships. This is at an 80% scholarship per program. Prior to this year scholarships were given at 100%. By comparison that would have been a total of \$2,190 if they were still given at 100%.
- Working with the Stage Committee on the Lotatorium project.
- Assisting the City to determine Common Consumption borders in the downtown area.
- Working to plan Tomorrow's Leaders Conference through KRPA as a member of the Professional Development Committee.
- Working with both the Finance Committee and Marketing and Promotions Committee on the Free Summer Food Program through USD 348.
- Community Wellness Festival took place on April 6th. Approximately 300 people were in attendance. BCRC took all registrations foe the Wellness Festival in 2019.
- Continuing to sell sponsorship packages specific to July 4th, Smoke on the Bricks, Summer Concert/Movie Series and Maple Leaf Gravel Grind.
- Continue to stay in contact with Baldwin Golf Association to be sure July 4th and Summer Concert/Movie Series needs are being met.

 continue to mid-May. Lumberyard Arts Center is moving their BBQ event to run in
 conjunction with Smoke on the Bricks.
- BCRC's transient guest tax request was granted. These funds will be used to market both Smoke on the Bricks and July 6th. The transient guest tax was then repealed by city council at the same meeting.
- Wine Fest will become and Craft Beer/Wine event in June of 2019. Looking to partner with Chamber and Lumberyard on expanding current event.
- Gathering information on the formulation of a Strategic Plan for Baldwin City Recreation Commission. Have received information from Lose and Associates and began conversations with PROS Consulting.
