1. Public Comments

Debbie Grosdidier, 619 Flame Way, had asked a question on why such an increase in the budget from 2018/2019 to 2019/2020. Director McClure indicated the increase for 2019/2020 she was seeing included the budget reserves. The published budget in the paper did not included the past years reserves. Ms. Grosdidier also asked what a mill was worth and if we could increase the mill levy ourselves. Director McClure indicated a mill was worth \$93,367.75 for the 2019/2020 budget cycle. McClure also indicated that BCRC cannot raise the mill levy that it takes USD 348 approval to raise the mill levy.
