2. Youth sports team formation survey results

Director McClure shared the results of the survey sent to youth sport parents and coaches in early April. The survey attempted to determine which method for selecting youth sports teams was most desirable. 142 participants took part in the survey. Per the survey, ultimately, by a small margin, most prefer the draft process.

- Team Sponsorships 22 baseball/softball teams are currently sponsored.
- E-sports Leagues has continually not gained participation for the past 3 leagues, I am not anticipating renewing this agreement for the time being which expires this summer.
- The Adult Cornhole League drew 28 teams this spring, 4 over the advertised maximum. It will be played on Monday nights, that began on April 12<sup>th</sup> for 5 consecutive weeks at Sullivan Square.
- BCRC applied for a donation from Cabela's/Bass Pro Shops. They have agreed to send us \$400 in gift cards to purchase fishing equipment, which we have received.
   BCRC will check out fishing equipment for people to use over the warm weather months.
- Jr. & Snag Golf for June/July is in the planning stages. More details to come as dates/times/staffing is finalized.
- BCRC will begin marketing the new outdoor pickleball courts soon. Promotion will include Monday/Thursday night pickleball at Baldwin High School Tennis Courts at 6:30pm. It will be a free program.
- Whitney completed the NAYS (National Association of Youth Sports) Academy Webinar on March 31<sup>st</sup>. She now has 60 days to take and pass the test to become a Certified Youth Sports Administrator.
