### **OLD BUSINESS**

1. Election of Commission President

## **NEW BUSINESS**

1. Pickle ball lines at the high school tennis courts

Director McClure shred with the board the desire to paint 3 pickle ball courts on the tennis courts at the high school. By doing so, it would expand BCRC programming capabilities as well as potentially introduce pickle ball to a population of the community we have not touched yet. 2. Concrete work at sports complex

Director McClure shared 3 quotes with the Board to take care of some drainage issues at the sports complex. The work would alleviate some standing water problems after storms and add sidewalks within complex near the batting cage area. The quotes came in as:

The Board voted to accept DL Concrete's bid of \$7,016. Commission Member Wright made a motion and Board Member Kerr made a  $2^{nd}$ , motion passed 5-0.

### Staff Reports-

- Baseball/Softball report will be presented on 08.19.2020 board meeting. Season ended on August 4<sup>th</sup> and went well considering all restrictions and extra precautions we put in place to operate leagues.
- Two more baseball tournaments are on the schedule for the last two weekends in September.
- Jr. Golf and SNAG Golf completed a second session in July in 2020. Normally we offer just one session.
- Fall sports numbers as of August 13<sup>th</sup>:
  - o K/1<sup>st</sup> Football- 13
  - o 2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> Football- 26
  - o 4<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> Football- 28
  - Micro Soccer- 11

  - o 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> Soccer- 32
  - o 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> Soccer- 23
  - o 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> Soccer- 13
  - o 7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup> Soccer- 8
- Currently seeking coaches for fall sports leagues. Once all spots are filled, coaches' meetings will follow, likely the week of August 17<sup>th</sup>. Practices will begin the week of August 24<sup>th</sup>. Games will begin September 12<sup>th</sup> for soccer and September 15<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> for flag football.
- Adult Cornhole League begins Monday, August 17<sup>th</sup> through September 21<sup>st</sup> skipping Labor Day. 24 teams (which is the max) signed up!
- Outdoor pickleball leagues will begin once the courts get painted at the high school looking into multiple leagues for different ages.
- We have extended our contract with Mission Control, so we will be rolling out more E-Sports Leagues this fall.
- Waivers are currently being collected by all participants parents/guardian before they can play.
- Day Camp ended on July 31<sup>st</sup> without incident. The most kids hosted at one time was 16. That happened once this summer.
- The pool looks great this summer thanks to a new paint job and Jay King keeping up on the chemical balance.
- Three days of the pool have been lost to storms this summer.
